# **ROADS & BRIDGES - Patty Meroni**

### **Monthly Report**

<u>2014 Road Program</u> - The 2014 road program began September 18, 2014 and will continue for the next few weeks until completion. A letter to residents was sent to remind them of upcoming construction.

<u>Longmeadow Parkway</u> - A status meeting with Longmeadow Parkway area residents will be held on Wednesday, October 8th at the Village Hall just to bring them up to date.

<u>Oak Lake Drainage Improvements</u> - The Village has requested an extension from Lake County Stormwater Management so as not to lose the grant money and give the other trustees an opportunity to meet with the resident and see the property.

<u>Functional Reclassification of Roadways</u> - Attached to this report is a resolution ordering the reclassification of the following roadways to local service road designation.

The Spring Creek Road application will be sent to the McHenry Council of Mayors after approval of this resolution and signature by President McLaughlin in order to meet the September 25th deadline for inclusion on the October 14<sup>th</sup> meeting agenda.

The resolution instructs the Roads and Bridges Committee to send the letter requesting reclassification back to local service road designation for the following roads:

Haeger's Bend Road, Ridge Road, Algonquin/River Road, Merri Oaks Road, Plum Tree Road and Helm Road

Once the McHenry County Council of Mayors advises what the process requires, as they stated in a conference call on Tuesday, September 16, 2014 that they had never had this request before and needed to investigate the procedure.

<u>Bike Path Resolution</u> – Attached is a resolution to adopt recommendations for village road design standards whereby the Roads and Bridges Committee is directed to limit its consideration of maintenance resurfacing and/or reconstruction of village maintained roads to exclude bicycle or shared use paths, bicycle lanes and pavement markings for shared bicycle lanes.

<u>Cuba Road Bridge</u> – The approval from IDOT Plat of Highways has been received, thus allowing for the negotiator to begin appraisals for the affected properties.

<u>2015 Roads and Bridges Program</u> – The proposed 2015 Road program will include Plum Tree Road from Ridge Road to the Village limits, Haeger's Bend Road from County Line Road to Chapel, balance of Meadow Hill Road not completed in 2014 and the reconstruction of the Cuba Road Bridge.

Trustee Harrington motioned that the Board send this back to the ZBA with some specific instructions on some things we've heard tonight. One very specifically that's loud and clear to him, is the public wants additional opportunity to have input. It's reasonable that the Board would like to see the results of some of the other proposed amendments. The best solution is probably the best of the four different suggested amendments.

Trustee Harrington updated his motion to send this back to the ZBA with the following instructions: We want them to do some more research and answer some questions regarding property tax relative to agriculture versus residential. Opportunity for the public to have an opportunity to have input and comment on a materially changed text amendment. And consider the other three amendments and come back with a single recommendation within sixty days from the time that the ZBA took action on September 19<sup>th</sup>. Trustee Selman seconded.
