TRAINING:

D.U.I. ARRESTS:

Department personnel made 4 D.U.I. arrests in June. This compares to 5 for the same period last year.

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June 2010

Burglary to Vehicle

10-4279 06-07-10 A tree service employee reported that sometime over the weekend, someone broke into and/or damaged several vehicles parked off of Penny Road on the ComEd power line property. Some vehicles had windows broken and items taken and some had the brake lines cut. No one was seen in the area. Detectives responded to photograph the scene.

DETECTIVE SUMMARY: Nothing of evidentiary value was located. Due to the number of people that have access vehicle, they were not processed.

Theft

10-4360 06-09-10 A Plum Tree Road resident reported the theft of jewelry. The complainant stated that she is in the process of moving and she had hired a couple people to help her pack. The theft was discovered after one of the subjects was seen in the closet where the jewelry was kept, however she did not see him take anything. She also advised that she hasn't actually seen the jewelry in two years. TOT Detectives.

DETECTIVE SUMMARY: Since the victim was in the process of moving, she was advised to check through her belongings when she unpacks, to make sure it wasn't packed away. The victim has not returned calls from detectives. Case is inactive pending further information from the victim.

10-4392 06-10-10 A Braeburn Road resident reported the theft of mail from her mailbox. The complainant stated that she sent her son out to get the mail and he came back with an open padded envelope that was supposed to contain a birthday gift card. The home was placed on an extra watch. No further action taken.

10-4559 06-17-10 A Marbury Lane resident reported that some time in the past two days, someone had taken her wedding ring set out of the bathroom. The only people that had been at the residence were the cleaning crew. TOT Detectives.

DETECTIVE SUMMARY: Detectives contacted the cleaning company to set up interviews with the crew that was at the home. The investigation is still ongoing.

10-4675 06-20-10 The daughter of a deceased Autumn Trail resident reported the theft of two Jet Ski and trailer from the residence. One Jet Ski had no identifiable information of serial numbers available, and the information on the other Jet Ski and trailer was not readily available. The daughter advised that she would forward the information to BHPD for follow-up. To date, no further information has been received. This case will remain inactive pending further information.

Credit Card Fraud

10-4418 06-11-10 A Spring Lane resident reported that when she went to use one of her credit cards, it was denied. When she contacted the credit card company, she was told that it was refused for lack of payment. The complainant was not aware of an outstanding balance. Further investigation showed purchases in the Chicago, IL and Janesville, WI area. The complainant believes that a classmate from college actually made the purchases. When she contacted him, he stated that he had filed for bankruptcy, which she took as him having no means to repay her. TOT Detectives.

DETECTIVE SUMMARY: At this time the victim is not being held responsible for the charges. Since most of the charges occurred in Janesville, WI, she was advised to contact them to make a report there as well. The investigation has been turned over to her bank and the Credit Card Company. No further action by BHPD at this time.

Menacing Dog

10-4512 06-15-10 A Roundstone Lane resident reported that the neighbor's dog ran across the road, onto his property and charged him in an aggressive manner. A local ordinance citation was issued to the dog's owner. No further action at this time.

Death Investigation

10-4663 06-20-10 Officers responded to an Oakdene Drive residence for a reported person not breathing. On arrival, the officer observed CPR being performed. The ambulance arrived along with the officer and determined that the subject was deceased. The victim had a known alcohol and drug problem. Detectives responded to the scene as well as the Illinois State Police Evidence Technician.

DETECTIVE SUMMARY: Detectives interviewed everyone present at the home. Case is pending autopsy results.



I trust you are enjoying a pleasant summer and are preparing for a nice Independence Day weekend. Our summer is going very well once again thanks to this good news.



Dear Chief Murphy:

Once again, yesterday, July 18, I called on the Barrington Hills Police Department for what would appear to most to be a trivial, probably mundane, problem at my house and the response was prompt and courteous. I have 2 small dogs who believe it is their duty to corner, harass or otherwise annoy small 4-legged wildlife, i.e., chipmunks, skunks, raccoons, and opossum. Unfortunately, this wildlife frequently take refuge in one of 2 culvert pipes which run under my driveway. My dogs follow into the culvert and as was the case before, do not reappear for hours. Repeated calls and attempts to lure out my dog(s) with treats produce no results, zip, nada, nothing.

After such a long period of no noise and no response, I become convinced that my dog has been attacked and is lying dead or badly injured inside the culvert. I resort to calling your agency as a way of possibly retrieving my pet from the pipe. Last night was the 2nd time.


I spoke to Dispatcher Stephanie who was very polite and said she would contact the officers on patrol. Office Parada arrived first and immediately checked the pipe on both ends; he didn't see my dog but did find a raccoon who was sitting at one end. He created some commotion and my "ferocious" dog ran out the other side—unharmd. Office Currie arrived during this activity and helped with "capturing" my dog before she could make a second attempt to go toe-to-toe with the raccoon.

Since I live alone, I am so appreciative and grateful for the assistance and sincerity of the men who are policemen in my community. Regardless of what they believe about the importance of a situation such as this, they are more than willing to lend a hand.

While one end of the culvert was blocked with a flagstone, the other was open; it now has, thanks to a fellow working in my house today, a small section of wire fencing across it.

Please extend again my sincere thanks to Officers Parada and Currie.
