Burglary

12-215 3-13-12 Officers responded to a Heron Lane residence for a reported residential burglary. The homeowner advised that she was out of the home for 2 ½ hours and did not set the alarm. When she arrived home, she went directly upstairs to the master bedroom. When she entered the room, she discovered that it had been ransacked. Detectives were notified and responded to the scene. Case turned over to Detectives.

DETECTIVE SUMMARY: An Illinois State Police Evidence Technician responded to process the scene. Evidence was sent to the crime lab for processing. Detectives continue to follow-up on leads.

12-232 3-21-12 An Officer responded to a Pond Gate Drive residence for a reported burglary to a shed. On arrival, the officer observed that the sliding window appeared to have been pried open. Bicycles, a snow thrower and rototiller were removed. The items were entered into LEADS. There are no suspects or leads. No further action at this time.

Theft

12-238 3-23-12 An Oak Knoll Road resident reported that he had his gate company out to service his inoperable gate. The service technician advised that someone had removed the "brain box" for the gate. He also advised that it appeared to have been done by someone that was familiar with the gate. The homeowner advised that the former owner of the residence had a dispute with the former gate company over money owed.

Damage to Property

12-233 3-21-12 A Spring Creek Road property owner advised that someone had broken into their house. The owner stated that nothing was missing, but someone had gone through everything. The property owner stated that they do not live in the home, but still have items there. Case turned over to Detectives.

DETECTIVE SUMMARY: The scene was processed with negative results. Photos were taken of the damage. Case remains open, but inactive pending further leads.

12-244 03-27-12 Officers responded to a Rolling Hills Drive residence on an alarm. While checking the perimeter of the home, an officer observed the garage man door had been pried. In speaking with the homeowner, he advised that they

never use that door, so he is unsure when the damage occurred. Detectives responded to photograph the scene.

- 12-257 03-31-12 A Donlea Road resident reported that sometime overnight the lights on his driveway gate were damaged. No one was seen in the area. The home was placed on an extra watch. No further action taken.

Criminal Trespass to Residence

- 12-242 03-27-12 An Elgin Road resident reported that he was watching television in his living room when a male subject walked into his home through an unlocked front door. The subject, upon seeing the resident, fled from the home in a white Pontiac. An ISPERN message went out to surrounding departments in attempt to locate the offender. No further action at this time.

Harassment

- 12-210 03-10-12 A Rolling Hills Drive resident came into BHPD to report harassment by phone. The complainant advised he met a woman on Facebook approximately a year ago and had not spoken to her in several months. Lately, she has been texting and calling him and his friends. He advised he was willing to sign complaints. Case turned over to Detectives.

DETECTIVE SUMMARY: Both parties involved report harassment with no confirmation from either party. If sufficient evidence becomes available, the case will be presented to the Cook County State's Attorney's office for charges.

Death Investigation

- 12-231 03-21-12 An officer responded to a Burning Oaks Trail residence for a report of an unresponsive male subject. On arrival, Fox River Grove Fire Department paramedics were already on scene administering CPR. After unsuccessful measures were taken, the elderly male was pronounced deceased at the scene. The McHenry County Coroner responded to the scene. The death appeared to be from natural causes. No further action taken.
