**Battery**

A subject stated he was on Penny Road and went off the road and struck a pole. A pick-up truck stopped and the male passenger got out of the vehicle and started yelling at him and struck him in the face. The subject was not able to provide any identifiable information on the subjects or vehicle. A crash report was completed and the subject was given a ride to his home in Carpentersville.

**Damage to Property**

While on patrol, an officer came across two vehicles on the side of the road in an apparent traffic altercation. The driver and passenger of unit one was out of their vehicle yelling at the driver of unit two. The passenger of unit one also damaged the hood of unit two. All subjects were brought into BHPD. All subjects were cited and given a court date. Case is pending.

**No DL / Suspended / Revoked DL**

Eight drivers were cited for not possessing a valid driver's license. Cases are pending a court date.

One driver was cited for driving with a revoked driver's license and released on bond. Case is pending a court date.

Four drivers were cited for driving on a suspended license and released on bond. Cases are pending a court date.

**Domestic**

Officers responded to a husband / wife domestic. On arrival, it was determined that there was no physical contact. The husband agreed to stay elsewhere for the night. Both parties were issued domestic violence handbooks. No further action taken.

**Premise Check**

While checking homes on house watch, two unsecured doors were located. The homes were checked and secured. A key holder was notified.

**Civil Matter**

A resident advised that he recently had repair work done at his home and the problem was not corrected. He was advised that it is a civil matter and he needed to contact the company. He was afraid that they may come to his home and damage his property. The home was placed on an extra watch.

### **Vehicle Lock-out**

Officer responded to a total of three vehicles with the keys locked inside. Entry was gained.

### **Other Public Service**

An officer met with a complainant in the lobby of BHPD concerning the safety of her granddaughter when she comes for a visit. The officer advised the complainant to contact BHPD when the granddaughter is here and we would check on her well being. No further action taken at this time.

A resident came into BHPD to request an officer take a breath sample, as random samples are required for his restricted driving permit. Documentation was completed for the breath sample. No further action taken.

### **Alarms**

While checking eight separate burglar alarms, officers located unsecured doors. The homes were checked and secured. No further action taken.

### **Traffic Altercation**

A complainant advised that she was on a school bus traveling on Bateman Road there were subjects walking horses taking up a large portion of the lane of traffic. While passing them, one of the subjects struck the side of the bus with what was described as a crop. The officer spoke with the subjects, who denied the allegation.

### **Well Being Check**

An officer responded to a Brinker Road residence to attempt to make contact with a subject that was babysitting. On arrival, it was determined that contact had already been made via phone. No problem found.

### **Lost Property**

A Helm Road resident reported a lost license plate from their vehicle. A report was completed for documentation and the license plate was entered into LEADS as lost.

### **Mailbox Damage**

A Sandalwood Lane resident reported their mailbox was removed from the post and damaged. No one was seen in the area. The home was placed on an extra watch.

### **Task Force Activity**

An officer responded to a NIPAS EST activation for an armed barricaded subject. After a lengthy standoff, the subject was taken into custody without incident.

### **Suspicious Auto / Persons**

A vehicle was observed in the area of Ridge and Merri Oaks with its lights off. A partial license plate was obtained. A vehicle matching the description and partial plate was located and it was determined that the driver was lost and looking for directions. No further action taken.

A County Line Road resident reported a suspicious person walking around their residence. In checking the area, the subject was located. He stated that he was a Jimmy John's driver attempting to make a delivery and he went to the wrong house. His story was verified. The complainant was satisfied. No further action taken.

An officer observed two subjects dressed in dark clothing walking along Route 62. In speaking with the subjects, one advised he was out walking to clear his head and the other advised that she wanted to follow the other to make sure he was OK. Both subjects were given a ride to their residence in Carpentersville. No further action taken.

In checking for a reported suspicious vehicle on Old Hart Road, the officer spoke with a subject who stated he was going to an Old Hart Road residence to meet someone. He went to the wrong address. The subject left the area. No further action taken.

### **Child Custody Exchange**

On two occasions, an officer stood by at an Otis Road residence for a child custody exchange. The exchange was made without a problem.

### **Animal Incidents**

An officer responded to a Spring Creek Road residence for a reported sick raccoon in the front yard. The raccoon was destroyed and disposed of it. No further action taken.

A malamute was picked up on Brinker Road and transported to Golf Rose Kennel. The owner was eventually identified and the dog was claimed.

A pit bull was picked up on Healy Road and transported to Golf Rose Kennel pending owner identification.

An anonymous complaint was received about the care of animals at an Old Dundee Road residence. An officer responded to the residence and observed the animals. The owner was contacted and no problems were noted.

An anonymous complaint was received about the care of horses at a Bateman Road property. An officer responded to the area and observed the horses. The owner was contacted and no problems were noted.

### **Suicidal Subject**

Officers responded to a Berron Lane residence for a third party call of a subject making suicidal threats. On arrival, it was determined that when the statement was made regarding "ending things", it was concerning the relationship and not her life. Report was unfounded.

Officers responded to a Sutton Road residence for a third party call of a suicidal subject. On arrival, the officers spoke with the subject who stated that she was not suicidal; she had been frustrated over a family matter. Firearms were removed from the residence for safe keeping. Medical treatment was refused. No further action taken.

### **Target Shooting Permit**

A Hart Road resident requested a renewal of their target shooting permit. The range officer is evaluating for approval.

### **Motorist Assist**

An officer responded to a car in the ditch in the area of Ridge Road and Plum Tree Road. On arrival, it was determined the vehicle was not damaged, just needed to be towed out. No further action taken.

An officer responded to the area of Route 59 / Route 62 for a vehicle stuck on the side of the road. On arrival, it was determined that the driver, when he was trying to push his vehicle, accidentally locked his keys in the car. The entry was gained to the vehicle and was pushed out of the snow bank.

### **Accidents**

Officers responded to four accidents with injuries.
