July 2013 Summary of Activity

Domestic Battery

Officers responded to a report of a domestic disturbance involving a battery. Both parties were arrested and held for bond call.

Assault

A motorist reported a road rage type incident and subsequent assault. The offender was arrested, processed and released on bond.

Theft

A theft of light fixtures was reported. The offender, who was known to the victim, was contacted by BHPD and the light fixtures were returned without incident. The victim declined to sign complaints. No further action taken.

A theft of an ATV was reported. There are no suspects or leads. The vehicle was entered into LEADS. Case is inactive pending further developments.

The country club reported having two subjects trespassing on their property and using the facilities without being members. The subjects also charged food to member accounts. They were advised to contact BHPD if the subjects return.

Criminal Damage

A resident advised that he had terminated an employee. The employee became upset and left a long skid mark in his driveway. The home was placed on an extra watch for 30 days.

Possession of Cannabis

While checking a parked vehicle, an officer observed subjects smoking cannabis. The subjects were arrested, cited and released on bond with a notice to appear in court.

No DL / Suspended / Revoked DL

No Valid Driver's License – 3 citations; Driving while License Suspended – 4 arrests.

Threats

A subject stated he received threatening phone messages from a subject he had been speaking to regarding the purchase of a vehicle. The complainant did not want any action taken, just documentation of the incident. No further action taken.

Fireworks

A resident advised that the neighbor was shooting off fireworks, which were scaring the horse. The officer located the fireworks debris. The complainant wished to sign a complaint. The

officer proceeded to the home of the offender, where the offender admitted to setting the fireworks. A citation was issued with a court date for appearance.

Premise Check

Officers discovered three unsecured doors during residential house watches. The premises were checked for signs of burglary and secured. Key-holders were notified.

Civil Matter

A resident contacted BHPD for a standby to remove property from a residence.

A resident reported items missing from the barn when a tenant moved their horse out. The items in question are in dispute over who actually owns them. All parties involved were advised the incident is a civil matter. No further action taken.

Lock Out

Officers responded to two vehicles with the keys locked inside. Entry was gained. No further action taken.

Alarms

Officers responded to four burglar alarms with an unsecured door. The premises were checked for signs of burglary and key-holders were notified.

Assist Utility Company

Assistance was requested while Com-Ed turned power off at a residence that was unlawfully utilizing electricity. The power was disconnected without incident. No further action taken.

Other Public Complaints

A complaint of flood water being pumped over a resident's property was received. An officer responded as well as a building department representative and a Lake County Environmental Health Inspector. It was determined that the pumping would not be stopped. The complainant was notified and advised to contact the Village Hall on the next business day. No further action taken.

Missing Person

A report of a missing adult, possibly suicidal was received. Officers and detectives followed up on leads and worked with area departments. The subject eventually returned home.

Citizen Assist

A resident turned in old gun powder and ammunition for disposal. It was placed in an evidence vault for storage until it can be disposed of properly.

Task Force Activity

The MCAT officer responded to a Major Crash Assistance Team callout for a traffic crash in Park City.

The NIPAS EST officer responded to Addison for a warrant service. The warrant was served without incident.

Child Visitation Dispute

A resident wanted it documented that her children's father failed to pick them up for their scheduled visitation. A report was generated. No further action taken.

Suspicious Circumstance / Person

A resident reported that a male subject came to her home regarding a dog found near her property. The resident reported that while speaking with the male subject, he made comments indicating that he has been hanging around the area and made her feel uneasy. The home was placed on an extra watch and the complainant was advised to call 911 if he returned. No further action taken.

A resident reported finding a golf cart on her property with a flat tire. Attempts to locate the owner were made. The complainant contact BHPD several days later and advised that it belonged to a family friend. No further action taken.

A resident reported a suspicious phone call with the caller claiming to be with the Federal Crime Enforcement Division. The officer attempted to contact the caller without success. A check of the number revealed other complaints with attempted scams. The complainant was advised to disregard the call.

Animal Incidents

Three stray dogs were picked up. Two of the owners were located and responded to pick up the dogs; the third was turned over to Strays Halfway House for adoption. No further action taken.

Accidents

Officers responded to the following traffic crashes during the month:

Child Safety Seat Inspection

An officer checked one child safety seat to ensure it was properly installed.
