October 2013 Summary of Activity

Assault

One subject was charged with assault after threatening bodily harm to another individual. The subject was processed and released on bond, pending a court appearance.

Burglary

A property owner reported someone broken into the garage and removed a couple items. No one was seen in the area. Case is inactive pending further leads.

Damage to Property

While checking a vacant home, an officer located a broken window. There was no evidence that entry was made to the residence. The key holder was notified. No further action taken.

There were two reports of mailbox damage during this reporting period.

Criminal Trespass to Property

While checking an alarm at a residence, officers located a door that was forced open. The home was searched, but no one was located inside the home. The home was secured. No further action taken.

Driving Under the Influence

There was one arrest for driving under the influence. The arrest originated as a driving complaint. The driver was processed and released on bond, pending a court appearance.

No Valid Driver's License – 4 citations; Driving while License Suspended / Revoked – 1 arrest; Suspended Registration – 3 arrests

Harassment by Telephone

A subject stated that he has been receiving harassing phone calls on his cell phone. The officer called the number the calls originated from and discovered it was from "prankdial.com". The complainant was advised of the results. No further action taken.

Premise Check

Officers discovered six unsecured doors during residential house watches. The premises were checked for signs of burglary and secured. Key-holders were notified.

Vehicle Lock Out

Officer assisted four subjects gain entry into their vehicles.

Alarms

Officers responded to five burglar alarms with unsecured doors. The premises were checked for signs of burglary and key-holders were notified.

Fire

Officers responded to assist the fire department for a fire. The fire was contained to a closet where a generator started on fire. The fire was extinguished by the fire department.

Found Property

A resident reported finding a bicycle on the side of the road. The serial number could not be located. The bicycle was brought into BHPD and turned over to detectives for property storage.

Task Force Activity

The NIPAS MFF officer responded to a call out in Skokie for a planned protest.

Suspicious Vehicle

A resident reported that they thought they were being followed. The area was checked and no one was located. The home was placed on an extra watch.

Neighbor Problem

An officer responded to a complaint over tree trimming. The complainant advised that the neighbor had hired a landscape company and they were trimming trees on his property. The complainant advised that he told the tree company they were on his private property and they did not have authorization to trim the trees there. The landscape company did leave when requested. The officer spoke with the both parties and the situation was resolved. No further action.

Child Custody Exchange

Officers responded to two requests for a stand-by during a child custody exchange.

Animal Incidents

Three stray dogs were picked up. The owner's of two were located and responded to pick up the dog; the other was turned over to Golf Rose Kennel pending owner identification. No further action taken.

Two stray horses were apprehended and returned to their residence.

Target Shooting Permit

A target shooting permit was renewed for another year, for the Barrington Hills Country Club.

Motorist Assists

A motorist reported that her vehicle started on fire as she was driving. The fire was extinguished by the fire department. The vehicle was removed, no further action.
