April 2014 Summary of Activity

Burglary

A resident reported that their home was burglarized while they were out for a few hours. Entry to the home was forced through a side door. The case remains under investigation.

A resident reported that some time overnight, someone entered their vehicle and removed some items. The complainant did not have serial numbers for the missing items. Case is inactive pending further leads.

Fraud

A resident reported that he discovered unauthorized payments made from his checking account. It appears the payments were withdrawn over several months. He has contacted the bank and the account has been closed. The bank is investigating further.

A resident reported a dispute with insurance companies regarding life insurance pay out. The complainant believes the insurance companies are concealing the truth to avoid paying the insurance benefit. The case is under investigation.

DUI / No DL / Suspended / Revoked DL

DUI – 3 citations; No Valid Driver's License – 4 citations; Driving while License Suspended / Revoked – 4 arrests

Disorderly Conduct

A contractor reported feeling threatened by another contractor on a job site. The complainant advised that during an argument, an employee on an excavating machine moved the machine toward him, coming close to hitting him. The machine operator advised that he had no intention of hitting the complainant; he was trying to stop the argument. The complainant wanted to press charges. The operator was given a local ordinance citation and advised of the court date.

Domestic

Officers responded to one reported domestic. The parties agreed to stay separated for the night. All parties were given domestic violence handbooks. No further action taken.

Bicycle Complaint

Several residents reported bicyclists riding in a large pack and not allowing vehicles to pass. The officers checked the area and were unable to locate them.

Vehicle Lock Out

Officers assisted four subjects gain entry into their vehicles.

Alarms

Officers responded to six burglar alarms with an unsecured door. The premises were checked for signs of burglary and key-holders were notified.

Found Property

A motorist found a weekly/monthly planner along the road. Contact was made with the owner and it was returned. No further action taken.

A bicycle was located along the road. The bicycle was brought into BHPD and turned over to investigations for property control.

Assist Other Agency

The NIPAS MFF officer responded to Broadview for an immigration protest. Protesters taken into custody were turned over to Broadview PD.

Child Visitation Dispute

A resident reported that her estranged husband had come to pick up their child earlier than the agreed upon time. The husband was advised that he would need to leave the residence until the agreed upon time and in the future he should communicate a time change.

Identity Theft

A resident reported receiving a suspicious call from her bank regarding her account. After she provided them with some of her personal identifiers she had an uneasy feeling and she contacted her bank. They advised that they had not contacted her. The bank closed the account in question.

A resident reported that she had received a credit card that she had not applied for. In checking her credit history, she discovered several other accounts in her name that were not hers. She had contacted the companies and all transactions would be stopped with a completed police report.

Animal Incidents

A resident reported that while out walking her puppy, a neighbor's dogs charged to attack the puppy. The complainant advised she blocked the dogs and was in turn bitten on her hand. The dog's owner could not provide vaccination documentation. McHenry County Animal Control is handling the follow-up.

Three dogs were picked up by BHPD and four were returned to their owners.

One injured deer was terminated and removed from roadway.
