**June 2014 Summary of Activity**

**Battery**

A motorist reported a battery occurred following a traffic accident. The offender was arrested and charged with battery. Case is pending a court appearance.

**Fraud**

A resident reported that they received an automated voice message stating it was the IRS and to call back regarding an issue that needed to be resolved. The officer attempted to call back the number; he was unsuccessful in reaching anyone. It should be noted that there have been several reports documenting fictitious calls stating it is the IRS that have been confirmed as a widespread scam.

**Damage to Property**

A resident reported that the tires on their vehicle had been slashed overnight. No one was seen in the area. No further action at this time.

There were two reports of mailbox damage during this reporting period.

**DUI's / No DL / Suspended / Revoked DL**

DUI's – 3 arrests; No Valid Driver's License – 6 citations; Driving while License Suspended / Revoked – 1 arrest

**Harassment**

A resident reported receiving harassing phone calls. The complainant stated the caller advised he was with a windows support service and was trying to gain access to their computer remotely. The resident refused to allow him access. No further action taken.

A resident reported receiving harassing phone calls from a company identified as Card Holder Services. The complainant was requesting a 'report only' to document the incident so AT&T could investigate the calls. No further action at this time.

A resident reported that she is receiving harassing calls and e-mails from an acquaintance regarding continued financial support. The complainant did not want any action taken at this time, only report documentation.

**Disorderly Conduct**

Countryside School reported a subject at the school being disorderly and swearing at staff. On arrival, the subject had left the area. The subject was located and warned that he was prohibited from the school property. No further action at this time.

**Lockout**

Officers responded to two vehicle lockouts. Entry was gained.

### **Alarms**

Officers responded to two burglar alarms with unsecured doors. The premises were checked for signs of burglary and key-holders were notified.

### **Other Public Complaints**

A resident reported two incidents that occurred at Village meetings in which she feels she is being harassed. A report documenting the incident was generated.

### **Found Property**

An officer, while preparing his squad for duty, located a bracelet in the vehicle. The bracelet was turned over to investigations for property storage pending identification of its owner.

A cell phone was found in the lot of the Village Hall / Police Department. The phone was turned over to investigations for property storage pending identification of its owner.

### **Task Force Activity**

The NIPAS EST officer responded to Hoffman Estates for an armed barricaded subject. The subject was taken into custody without incident.

The NIPAS EST officer responded to Mount Prospect for a security detail for a large gathering of a motorcycle gang. The gathering went without incident.

### **Assist Ambulance**

Officers responded to a report of a subject burned. The subject was lighting a fire for a controlled burn, when the gasoline fumes contributed to a flash fire, burning the subject. The subject was transported to St. Alexius for numerous burns on his body.

### **Animal Incidents**

A resident reported that his dog had been attacked by the neighbor's dog. At this time, he only wanted the incident documented and requested that no action be taken.

Six dogs were picked up by BHPD and were returned to their owners.

Two injured deer were terminated and removed from the roadway.
