Damage to Property

- 10-2453 04-04-10 A Rolling Hills Drive resident reported damage to his mailbox. No one was seen in the area. The home was placed on an extra watch.

Domestic


Dear Chief Murphy:

On behalf of the Arlington Heights Police Department, please accept my sincere thanks for the expert assistance provided by Investigator Ronald Ruffin as a representative of your agency and a member of the Major Case Assistance Team (MCAT). The Major Case Assistance Team was activated to provide investigative and forensic support in connection with a partial body that was discovered in our town on April 16, 2010.

On that date, at approximately 1630 hours, a maintenance man who is employed at the Marketview Apartments in the area of Dryden and Kensington discovered a black plastic bag that contained the remains of a male human being. Upon further investigation, it was determined that only the lower half of the body was in the bag. The responding MCAT Investigators spent many hours canvassing the neighborhood attempting to learn the identity of the remains, and the Forensic Technicians worked long hours processing the scene.

Although we have yet to learn the identity of the human remains, I am certain that without the assistance of your officer, we would not have accomplished the large amount of work that was done over a two day period. Please convey my appreciation to your staff for the valuable assistance they provided to our community and their dedication as evidenced by their ongoing commitment to and participation in MCAT.
