**Damage to Property**

**Theft**

- 11-6963      10-10-11      While checking a vacant home, an officer observed that someone had removed the internal parts of the air condition unit. The property owner was contacted. No further action taken.
- 11-6997      10-15-11      The caretaker for a Cross Timber property reported that the riding mower was taken sometime in the last two weeks. The complainant advised that the mower is kept outside under a tarp without the keys. He stated that it has been kept that way for two years without incident. TOT Detectives.


Mr. Bak has asked me to send this email on his behalf since he does not have access to an email account.
