Domestic

- 12-268 04-06-12 Officers responded to a husband / wife domestic on Marbury Lane. The husband reported that the wife had been yelling at the children. The wife advised that she was very agitated. The wife made no threat to herself or the children. No further action at this time.
- 12-305 04-19-12 Officers responded to a reported husband / wife domestic on Royal Way. On arrival, officers spoke to both parties. The husband was arrested and charged with domestic battery and unlawful interference with the reporting of domestic violence.

Burglary

- 12-316 04-21-12 Officers responded to a report of a residential burglary at an Ascot Lane residence. On arrival, the complainant advised that he was the son of the homeowner and he was there to check on the dog and discovered that the home had been burglarized. A BHPD Detective and an Illinois State Police Evidence Technician responded to the scene. Detectives continue to follow-up on leads. Case remains active.

Theft

- 12-325 04-25-12 A Bateman Road resident reported the theft of sterling silverware. The theft occurred sometime in the last month. The complainant advised she was going to get an estimate and forward to BHPD. No further action at this time.
- 12-327 04-26-12 A Bateman Road resident reported the theft of a trailer. He advised that he noticed it missing approximately 6-weeks ago, but thought someone had borrowed it and would return it. The trailer was entered into the LEADS system.

Deceptive Practice

- 12-304 04-18-12 The Village Hall reported receiving a returned check for insufficient funds. The check had been received for payment of a compliance ticket. The offender is supposed to come into BHPD this week and pay the fine with cash.
- 12-306 04-19-12 A Barrington Hills resident reported unauthorized charges were made on her account. A report was generated for documentation. The bank is investigating the charges.

Forgery

12-321 04-24-12 An Otis Road resident reported that someone had stolen a check from his checkbook and cashed the check. The victim believed the offender was an old friend that had been in his home. The victim did not want to pursue any charges at this time. His bank is investigating further. No further action by BHPD.

Credit Card Fraud

12-291 04-11-12 A Barrington Hills resident came into BHPD to report that she had been contacted by her bank regarding suspicious charges on her account. Further investigation revealed there were over \$3000 in fraudulent charges. The bank is investigating further. No further action taken by BHPD.

12-333 04-29-12 A Barrington Hills resident came into BHPD to report that her ex-husband has been trying to obtain a credit card in her name. He has been denied each time.

Damage to Property

12-283 04-10-12 An Otis Road resident reported that sometime overnight, the lights at the end of their driveway were damaged. Video surveillance was turned over to detectives. Detectives are reviewing video footage. Case remains active.

12-293 04-12-12 While on patrol, a BHPD officer was advised of damage to a home on Spring Lane. In checking further, the officer observed that the door was damaged and forced open. The home is currently vacant and in foreclosure. The bank was advised of the damage. No further action taken.

12-330 04-26-12 A Barrington Hills Road resident reported that his fence was damaged. No one was seen in the area. It is unknown how the damage occurred. No further action taken.

Runaway

12-274 04-05-12 A Rock Ridge Road resident reported that as she was getting ready to take her son for his counseling session, he stated that he was not going and walked out the door. The son was located at his father's house and returned to his mother. No further action taken.

Illegal Transportation of Alcohol

12-314 04-20-12 While checking a vehicle in a church parking lot, an officer observed the vehicle occupants with open liquor. All subjects were cited for illegal transportation of alcohol. The driver was arrested on an outstanding warrant and turned over to McHenry County.

DWLS

- 12-280 04-09-12 An officer observed a vehicle turn onto Route 25, causing another vehicle to swerve to avoid hitting it. In stopping the vehicle, the officer determined the driver was driving on a suspended license. He was arrested for DWLS and failure to yield.

Disorderly Conduct

- 12-309 04-20-12 A report of subjects throwing fireworks out of the car window. The subjects, one from Barrington Hills and one from Barrington, were identified and charged with disorderly conduct.

Premise Checks

- 12-267 04-04-12 While checking an alarm on Bisque Drive, an adjacent home's door was unsecured. The home was vacant. It was checked by the officers and then secured.
- 12-270 04-05-12 While checking a home on the house watch list on Rolling Hills Drive, a garage service door was found unsecured. The home was checked and the door was secured.
- 12-282 04-09-12 While checking a home on the house watch list on Old Sutton Road, a rear door was found unsecured. The home was checked and the door was secured.

Civil Matter

Investigation indicates that since this is an established residence for the subject, he could ask her to leave voluntarily, but he could not have her removed. The subject agreed to leave the property until the property owner returns. No further action at this time.

- 12-288 04-10-12 A Pond Gate Road resident reported that a male subject came to her door and rang the bell, when she didn't answer; he left in a black 4-door sedan. Video footage was turned over to detectives.
- 12-315 04-21-12 A complainant reported that when she is caring for her horses at a barn on Bateman Road, there is a suspicious vehicle that drives by frequently. Officers spoke with the offender, a Barrington Hills resident, who stated he is just checking the area. No problem found.
- 12-322 04-25-12 A Caesar Drive resident reported that when she was taking her garbage out, she observed a dark sedan pull into her neighbor's driveway across the street. She shouted at the subject asking him what he wanted. He never

responded, but he did leave the area. Due to the darkness, no further vehicle description was available.

12-313 04-20-12 A Fox Hunt property owner advised that at the close of her estate sale a male black, male white and female white showed up in separate vehicles, each asking if the owner lost a dog. The owner then observed the three vehicles at the end of her driveway. The complainant was concerned that possibly he was casing her home due to the recent burglaries. Due to a delay in reporting the incident, the vehicles were not located.

12-328 04-26-12 A Merri Oaks Road resident reported receiving a suspicious call from a male subject claiming to be her grandson. It is believed this was an attempt to get money from her. The home was placed on an extra watch.

12-331 04-28-12 A Brinker Road resident reported that she has painters at her home and she located a "smart key" and another tool that she thought might be a lock pick. The officer collected the items and determined that the tools are for re-keying a lock, not a lock pick. Items turned over to investigations.

Neighbor Problem

The complainant advised he felt this was an invasion of his property and he did not want the neighbor going through his mailbox. The officer spoke with the offender. He stated he was unaware that he could not place items in mailbox and in the future, he would send it through the postal service.

Driving Complaint

12-310 04-20-12 A motorist came into BHPD to report that while she was driving on Route 62 east of Route 25, the driver of the vehicle behind her appeared to become irate. He proceeded to pass her vehicle and come to a complete stop blocking the lane of traffic. He then exited his vehicle and punched her driver's side window, causing it to shatter. Attempts are being made to contact the driver for an interview. Case remains active with charges pending.
