Aggravated Battery / Battery

12-389 05-20-12 An officer responded to Route 14 and Main Street in Barrington to meet with a victim of an aggravated battery that occurred on Bateman Road. The victim advised that he was driving north on Bateman Road from Route 62 when a vehicle came up along the side of his vehicle and rammed his vehicle trying to force him off the road. The subjects in the vehicle then threw landscape bricks at him, striking his arm and vehicle.

The victim was transported to GSH for medical treatment. The suspects were identified and charged with felony aggravated battery. Two of the three have been arrested and taken to Cook County Jail. The third suspect has not been arrested as of this date. The warrant remains active.

12-388 05-20-12 Officers responded to an Otis Road residence for a reported battery in progress. On arrival, the parties involved were separated. One subject stated he had stopped at the residence to drop paperwork off to his ex-wife. His companion started to pull weeds in the flower beds causing the caretaker to become upset. The caretaker claimed that he was pushed. There were no visible injuries and no one wanted to pursue charges. The uninvited guests left the residence. No further action taken.

Burglary

12-339 05-02-12 A Plum Tree Road resident reported that he had just arrived home from a three week absence and discovered that his home had been burglarized. He advised the back glass door had been removed and items were missing from his basement and yard area. The rest of the home was untouched. Detectives responded to process the scene. There are no suspects or leads. Photos of the scene were taken. The case remains open, but inactive pending further developments.

Theft

12-348 05-07-12 A contractor remodeling a Brinker Road home reported that two air conditioning units had been removed from the residence. The complainant reported that the units had been disconnected for the remodel back in March. He doesn't remember the last time he saw them. There are no suspects or leads.

Deceptive Practice

12-400 05-24-12 A check received for payment of two compliance citations was returned for non sufficient funds. A certified letter was mailed to the offender advising him that he would face charges if the payment was not received. The offender did make proper payment. No charges filed. Case is closed.

12-304 Follow-up from last month, restitution was made in lieu of charges for deceptive practice. Case Closed.

Damage to Property

12-347 05-07-12 A Round Barn Road resident reported damage to a tree in the cul-de-sac island. There were tire tracks in the grass and the tree was lying on its side. No one was seen in the area. The Village tree removal service was notified to remove the tree. No further action taken.

12-349 05-07-12 An officer responded to the area of Creekside Lane and Old Sutton Road for a report of a damaged weight limit sign. On arrival, the officer observed the sign to have spray paint all over it. The Village contractor was notified to replace the sign. No further action taken.

12-408 05-29-12 A Steeplechase Road resident reported that a driveway lamp had been damaged. He did not see anyone in the area; however he did locate rocks in the area that appeared to have been the cause of the damage.

Criminal Trespass

12-378 05-16-12 An officer responded to a Brinker Road residence regarding a trespass complaint. The complainant reported that their sign posting the property as "No Trespassing" had been covered with a magnet. The complainant advised that they suspected the neighbor of covering the sign due to their history of neighbor issues. In speaking with the neighbor, the officer determined that it was in fact the neighbor that covered the sign. A citation was issued and a court date assigned. The officer explained the Village Code on No trespassing to both parties. No further action taken.

Possession of Drug Equipment

12-413 05-30-12 An officer, responding to assist another officer in checking a vacant, unsecured, premise located an occupied vehicle in the driveway. In speaking with the driver, the officer detected an odor of cannabis. A search of the vehicle resulted in locating cannabis smoking equipment. The passenger admitted to the equipment being his. A citation issued and court date given. The evidence was turned over to investigations. No further action taken.

Driving Under the Influence

12-390 05-20-12 Officers responded to Old Sutton Road and Creekside for a reported motorcycle crash with injuries. On arrival, officers located the driver and vehicle. Witness statements indicate the driver was traveling at a high rate of speed when he lost control and struck a power pole. The paramedics advised that there was a strong odor of alcohol. The officer responded to the hospital and spoke with the driver. He admitted to drinking prior to the crash. He was

cited for Driving Too Fast for Conditions, No insurance, Violation of Classification of License and DUI. A court date was issued.

12-403 05-26-12 While driving on Old Sutton Road, an officer observed a vehicle crossing the center line. A traffic stop was made. The driver was charged with DUI, Improper Lane Usage, Possession of Cannabis and Illegal Transportation of Open Liquor. The passenger was charged with Illegal Transportation of Open Liquor. The vehicle was released to the driver's mother. The driver was processed and released on bond and the passenger was issued a notice to appear in court. No further action taken.

12-407 05-28-12 While in the parking lot of the Methodist Church, an officer was advised of a motorist stopped in traffic at Route 62 / Route 59, and appeared to be sleeping. On arrival, officers attempted to wake the driver. The paramedics were also summoned to the scene. An odor of alcohol was noted. The subject was arrested and cited with Illegal Parking, DWLS, DUI and DUI over .08. He was processed and released on bond. Case is pending a court appearance. No further action.

No Drivers License / Driving While License Suspended

12-342 05-05-12 An officer stopped a vehicle with expired registration. Speaking with the driver, it was determined she did not have a valid driver's license. She was arrested and charged with Driving While License Suspended. A court date was issued.

12-377 05-16-12 The driver of a vehicle stopped for speeding was cited for Driving Without a Valid License. He was arrested and given a court date.

12-357 05-09-12 In checking a vehicle registration, it was determined the registration and vehicle owner were both suspended. The driver (vehicle owner) was cited for Driving While License Suspended as well as Suspended Registration. She was cited and issued a court date.

Harassment

12-383 05-17-12 An officer met with a complainant in the lobby of BHPD regarding a phone message left on his cellular phone. The complainant advised there is an ongoing civil problem with the offender. He further advised that he did not want to sign a complaint; he wanted BHPD to contact the offender and advise him to cease any further contact. A message was left on the offender's voicemail. No further action taken.

12-384 05-18-12 An officer met with a complainant in the lobby of BHPD. She advised that she had received an e-mail from a subject threatening to post compromising photos of her on the internet. The complainant, at this time only wanted her home placed on an extra watch. She was also advised to consider blocking the e-mail address and closing her face book account. No further action taken at this time.

On arrival, officers spoke with the subject that advised he and his mother had a verbal argument over her wanting him to see a therapist. At no time was there any physical contact. The father indicated that his wife had called him stating that their son was out of control and he broke a coffee table. The parents declined to sign complaints for the damage. No further action at this time.

The complainants stated that they had been trying to reach the residents all day without success. They advised they could hear what appeared to be a car running in the garage.

Officers were able to gain entry with a key provided by the complainants. In checking the home two bodies were discovered. Investigators were called to the

scene. With the evidence collected at the scene and the medical examiner's report, the deaths were ruled a murder – suicide.

Dear Chief,

The Cook County Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM) has been working to implement a strategic plan to ensure that our Urban Area has processes and plans in place to ensure that our region is as well-positioned as possible to protect and prevent against, respond to and recover from any incident, whether man-made or natural.

Under the leadership of President Toni Preckwinkle, I believe that we have already made great strides at accomplishing the above, in just a short time. Critical to this effort, is our outreach to local jurisdictions and strategic partners; in this, Cook County has been working with local jurisdictions to develop a comprehensive and thoughtful training and exercise program in the event of a homeland security or emergency management incident.

Most recently, during the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Summit, DHSEM provided training and equipment to first responders, including members of your department. While particular entities were on stand-by from 18 May through 22 May for NATO-related activities, extensive training was provided and fire extinguishing equipment as well as personal hydration systems were issued by DHSEM to first responders.

Participating and supporting the above exercises, both through personnel as well as through the devotion of federal homeland security grant dollars, is part of the commitment now being made by Cook County. The ability to directly support the training of first responders is a critical priority for our department.

I would also like to recognize and commend the members of your department who participated in this effort; their dedication and professionalism reflect positively on our public safety agencies as well as the commitment of your jurisdiction to promoting safety and security in our Urban Area.
