Burglary

12-632 08-11-12 Officers responded to a Rolling Hills Drive residence for a delayed burglary report. On arrival, it was determined that some electronics and jewelry were missing from the home. In viewing the home video surveillance, two male subjects were seen going through the home. Several leads were developed with one arrest made; additional arrests are expected.

12-638 08-14-12 An officer responded to a Hills and Dales Road residence for a reported burglary to vehicle. On arrival, it was determined that items were taken from two unlocked vehicles while they were parked in the driveway. The home was placed on an extra watch. No other burglaries to auto were reported in the area during this time. Investigation is closed pending additional leads.

Theft

12-606 08-03-12 A Bateman Road complainant reported that someone entered the barn and removed some items. No one was seen in the area. No further action at this time.

12-613 08-06-12 An officer responded to a County Line Road residence for a reported theft. On arrival, it was determined that a basement door had been forced open. It did not appear that anything was missing from the home; however, several contractors working at the home had reported various items missing from the property. The property owner is in the process of having an alarm system installed. Case is inactive pending further information from the contractors.

On arrival, the officer checked with the resident at that address, who stated that no one there had taken a cab. It is unknown who the offenders are or where they went. No further action taken.

Credit Card Fraud

12-656 08-20-12 A Leeds Drive resident reported that she had unauthorized charges on her credit card stemming from a previous visit to New York. The credit card company is investigating. No further action taken.


Please commend Jeremy Hensler for his/her efforts on our behalf and for their commitment to law enforcement in general by being someone we can all count on as a member of NIPAS.
