Battery

12-797 10-13-12 Officers responded to an Old Sutton Road residence for a reported battery complaint. On arrival, officers spoke with both parties. The victim stated that the offender had attempted to block his exiting the property and grabbed his hand bending it back. The victim signed a complaint. Both parties were issued a notice to appear in court. No further action at this time.

Theft

12-769 10-03-12 An Alderberry Lane resident reported that while she was out walking, she recovered an empty package addressed to her. She advised that she had placed an order the previous month. The web site showed that the package was delivered, but she had never received it.

12-774 10-03-12 A Bow Lane resident reported the theft and forgery of a check. It is unknown when the theft occurred or who may have taken the check. The case is being investigated by the bank. Report made for documentation only. No further action taken.

12-799 10-15-12 An Algonquin Road business reported that sometime during the evening, someone removed tire rims from his property. Video surveillance showed a truck backed in and subjects removing the rims, however the license plate was not visible. Case is inactive pending further leads.


