June 2013 Summary of Activity

Battery

Officers responded to a report of a disturbance involving a battery. The victim declined to sign complaints. Both parties went their separate ways. No further action taken.

Theft

A complainant came into BHPD to report that a motorcycle that was being stored in Barrington Hills was missing and apparently stolen. The last time the motorcycle was seen, was over a year ago. It is unknown exactly when it was taken.

Criminal Damage

A resident reported that someone had broken into his home and damaged several items, as well as put holes in some walls. It did not appear that anything was missing from the home. The home was placed on an extra watch.

A resident reported damage to a garage door. It appeared that someone attempted to pry the door causing damage. Nothing appeared to be missing from the home.

A resident reported damage to their driveway gate. It is unknown what caused the damage. No one was seen in the area.

Illegal Consumption by Minor

While checking a vacant home, an officer observed two subjects on the property consuming beer. Both subjects were cited and released to an adult.

DUI

There were four arrests for driving under the influence; three of which originated as a traffic crash, cellular 911 calls. There was also a DUI assist to Algonquin PD, which originated as a driving complaint.

No DL / Suspended / Revoked DL

No Valid Driver's License – 1 citation; Driving while License Suspended – 3 arrests.

Domestic Dispute

Officers responded to four domestic dispute incidents. All incidents were verbal in nature. All parties were given domestic violence handbooks and all parties declined further assistance.

Ordinance Violation

A subject was cited for an unattended open burn of landscape waste. The fire was extinguished by the fire department.

Premise Check

Officers discovered seven unsecured doors during residential house watches. The premises were checked for signs of burglary and secured. Key-holders were notified.

Civil Matter

A resident contacted BHPD for advice regarding an incident between her children and their father. A report was generated for documentation only. No further action taken.

Other Public Service

Complainant advised of an attempted scam when funds sent exceeded the amount of the purchase. The buyer wanted the complainant to turn over cash for the difference. The complainant did not fall for the scam and notified BHPD for information only.

A resident turned over some firearms for safekeeping. They were turned over to detectives for storage in the evidence vault for safekeeping.

Alarms

Officers responded to three burglar alarms with an unsecured door. The premise was checked for signs of burglary and a key-holder was notified.

Assist Utility Company

Assistance was requested with a road closure while Nicor repaired a broken gas main.

Traffic Altercation

An officer responded to a traffic complaint between a motorist and a bicyclist. The officer spoke to all parties involved and the bicyclist declined to sign a complaint.

Other Public Complaints

Complaints of two reports of threats by a third party were received. An extra watch and a patrol alert were generated.

Two residents reported flooding on their property and requested photo documentation. Photos were taken and forwarded to the village hall for follow-up.

A resident reported excessive flooding on his property and into his home. He believes it may be related to ongoing work in the area. A report was generated for documentation.

Check for Well Being

Three separate requests for well being checks were received. One, no problem found; One resulted in the subject staying with family for the night; and the third resulted in the subject being transported for evaluation.

Found Property

An I-pass was located in the driveway to the Police Department / Village Hall. Attempts were made to contact the owner. The I-pass was turned over to detectives for storage.

A bicyclist turned in a purse that was found on Route 62. The owner was contacted and came in to claim her property.

Warrant Service

A subject on a traffic stop was determined to have an outstanding warrant. The subject was taken into custody; the required bond amount was posted and court date issued.

Assist Ambulance

Officers responded to an ambulance assist for a subject unresponsive. The AED was deployed and CPR was given. The fire department took over on their arrival. The subject was transported to the hospital.

Suspicious Circumstance / Person

A resident reported finding a suspicious person in their garage. The subject fled in a vehicle and was not located.

A resident reported a subject buzzing the gate and then fleeing when asked what he was there for. The officers checked the area and were unable to locate the subject.

Driving Complaint

A motorist reported a traffic altercation on Route 62 in which the offender threw chewing tobacco into the vehicle. Incorrect license plate data was given. The vehicle was not located.

Identity Theft

A resident advised that four tickets for a baseball game, they didn't purchase, were delivered to the home. In checking their bank account records, several unauthorized charges were discovered. An identity theft affidavit was completed. The investigation is being handled by the bank.

Fishing Complaint

A resident reported subjects fishing on a private lake. When he asked the subjects to leave, they made threatening statements. The officer located the subjects and advised them they

were not to return to the property or the lake. The complainant did not want any further action taken at this time.

Child Custody Exchange

Officers responded to a request for a stand-by during a child custody exchange.

Animal Incidents

Three stray dogs were picked up. The owners were located and responded to BHPD to pick up the dogs. No further action taken.

BHPD Officer Firing Weapon

Officers responded to five reports of injured wildlife and used their duty weapon to terminate the suffering animals.
