The Fox Point Foxes and Martini Moms book clubs are among the donors who've stepped forward to help stock the Carpentersville school's new Little Free Library.

Co-founders Robin Ross-Henning and Annemarie Crowley and volunteer Sarah Hoban are the library stewards and will restock the library weekly.

Children are able to take a book and return a book. It's an honor system library that encourages children to read by giving them access to books.

Sunny Hill administrators and staff have been extremely supportive, Ross-Henning noted, identifying CUSD 220 Enrichment Instruction Specialist Lori Ford as a key champion of the project.

Ross-Henning and Crowley collected cash donations and books from their book groups, friends and the Barrington Newcomers and Neighbors Club,

"Annemarie has been unbelievably tenacious in getting books," Ross-Henning said, adding Crowley is working with Half-Price Books in Palatine, which has donated boxes of books every month.
