

**ORDINANCE AMENDING
THE VILLAGE CODE OF BARRINGTON HILLS**

WHEREAS, the President and the Village Board of Trustees for the Village of Barrington Hills (the "Village") at its regularly scheduled meeting of March 27, 2006, determined that it was in the best interest of the Village to establish a Drug/Gang/DUI Fund whose purpose is, among other things, to pay for the cost of equipment to assist the Village Police Department in performing its duties, and specifically, to assist in the prevention of alcohol-related criminal violence.

WHEREAS, the Drug/Gang/DUI Fund will be funded through private donations and revenue received by the Village under subsection 5/11-501(j) of the Illinois Vehicle Code for arrests made in the Village that result in a person being found or pleading guilty to driving under the influence.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1-1-3 of the Village Code, certain Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills ("Village") proposed amendments to Title 1, Chapter 9 of the Village Code to add the Drug/Gang/DUI Fund to the Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, Cook, Kane, Lake and McHenry Counties, Illinois, as a home rule municipality, the following:

Section 1: Recitals. The Village Board hereby finds that the recitals contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are true and correct and does incorporate them into this Ordinance by this reference.

Section 2: Chapter 9. The title of Title 1, Chapter 9 of the Code shall be, and the same hereby is, amended to delete the current title, which shall be replaced with the following:

"MUNICIPAL REVENUE".

Section 3: Drug/Gang/DUI Fund. Section 1-9 of the Code shall be, and the same hereby is, amended to add the following subsection:

"1-9-2: **DRUG/GANG/DUI FUND:** There shall be established a special fund known as the 'Drug/Gang/DUI Fund' for the purpose of, among other things, purchasing law enforcement equipment that will assist in the prevention of alcohol-related criminal violence with funds received by the Village pursuant to subsection 5/11-501(j) of the Illinois Vehicle Code."


Section 4: Validity. Should any part or provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part declared to be invalid.

Section 5: Superseder and Effective Date. All resolutions, motions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith, are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded; and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.


